In addition, they are now working hard in order to secure their chosen college and course Post-16 and were able to meet all the post-16 providers on site at the beginning of October. 






# **Black History Month Reading List 2022**



Age Range: All Did you know that the richest person ever to have lived was a West African? Or that the technology that made the lightbulb was developed by African American inventor, & not Thomas Edison? How about the fact that Ethiopia was the only African country to avoid colonization, thanks a brave queen? Stacked with facts & visually vibrant, Timelines from Black History: Leaders, Legacies, Legends is a hive of information on the people & issues that have shaped Black history.



Age Range: All Silence is NOT an option - use your voice for change. A book to empower & navigate your world to create a more positive society. Stuart Lawrence tells us about what he has learned from life & tools that have helped him live positively to keep him moving forwards when times have been tough. Stuart Lawrence is the younger brother of Stephen Lawrence, who was murdered on 22 April 1993, aged just 18, in an unprovoked racist attack.



Age Range: All Find your own lane. You are only in competition with yourself. Marcus Rashford MBE is recognised worldwide for his journey both on & off the pitch – but how did a boy from south Manchester become not only an International footballer but also one of the leading activist voices in the UK. His tireless activism fighting for the rights of children in the UK for free school meals over lockdown, led to government policy U-turn. Anything is possible with hard work, good friends, & positivity.



Age Range: All A rich & revealing story of long relationship between the British Isles & people of African Caribbean; from the Windrush scandal to the Black Lives Matter protests of 2020, events which put black British history at the centre of urgent national debate. Black & British is vivid confirmation that black history can no longer be kept separate & marginalised; it's woven into the cultural & economic histories of the nation & it belongs to us all.



Age Range: 14+ Starr Carter, an African-American teenager, faces pressure from various communities & tries to stand up for what is right after she witnesses the shooting of her childhood best friend Khalil at the hands of a police officer. Starr must find her voice & stand up for what is right.



Age Range: 14+ When fourteen-year-old Shaq is stabbed outside of a busy shopping centre in Manchester, three teenagers from very different walks of life are unexpectedly brought together. What follows flips their worlds upside down and makes Chantelle, Jackson, and Marc question the deeprooted prejudice and racism that exists within the police, the media, and the rest of society.



Age Range: 11+ 12-year-old Jerome is shot by a police officer who mistakes his toy gun for a real threat. As a ghost, he observes the devastation that's been unleashed on his family & community in the wake of what they see as an unjust & brutal killing. Soon Jerome meets another ghost: Emmett Till, a boy from a very different time but similar circumstances. Emmett helps Jerome process what has happened, on a journey towards recognizing how historical racism may have led to the events that ended his life. A powerful message that 'Only the living can make the world a better place to



Age Range: 11+ Hate crime can take many forms including cyber bullying on social media, homophobia & racism. Eve, whose older sister Rosie was killed when walking home one night with her boyfriend where witnesses stood by & let it happen. This raises an important question would you have had the guts to stand up to those thugs or would vou have been too frightened? This story shows how hate not only damages the attacked but also the whole society. Respect & acceptance are the only cures.



Age Range: A collection of very personal poetry based on author's own unique story. From the UK to Nigeria, & back again, Karl seeks to share his life journey, & explain how it has shaped who he has become today. What would you do & how would you feel if you were suddenly taken away from all that you know? Read on, & you will find out how Karl responded, in this very particular & curious case.



Age Range: 15+

Exploration of diversity problems in education by Cambridge graduates, Chelsea Kwakye & Ore Ogunbiyi. As a minority in a predominantly white institution, taking up space is an act of resistance. In higher education, you constantly have to justify your existence within institutions that weren't made for you, is an ongoing struggle for many people. Featuring honest conversations with students past & present. Going beyond the buzzwords of diversity & inclusion, exploring what it truly means to young black girls today.



Age Range: All Meet 52 icons of colour from the past & present in this celebration of inspirational achievement— a diverse collection vibrantly illustrated stories about changemakers to encourage, inspire & empower the next generation of changemakers.



Age Range: 50 famous inspirational & under-celebrated women from Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, Nepal & Sri Lanka. South Asian girls will have a chance to dream about lives for themselves that radically differ from the limited narratives & stereotypes written for them by their culture, wider society & the mainstream media.



Age Range: 15+ Stylist Love is never just black & white. A sharp & authentic love story about 16-year-old Cynthia, who finds herself caught between two brothers: one who is Black & the other who is white.



Age Range: 15+ Following a Black teenager who is sent to prison for a crime he didn't commit, this deeply affecting verse novel explores systemic racism in today's America & the power of art to transform lives.


